Information for Parents about The Brook Nursery

Thank you for showing an interest in The Brook Nursery. We hope that this information sheet answers most of your questions. When should I register my child?

You should register with the nursery once your child becomes two years old. Registration forms are available from the school office or on-line via our website (www.brook.w-sussex.sch.uk). We will need to have a copy of your child's birth certificate. Please therefore bring it in with your registration form so that we can copy it to confirm your child's date of birth.

How old does my child need to be in order to be considered for a place?

Children who are 3 and 4 years old can attend The Brook Nursery and can start from their third birthday. Your child is eligible for free entitlement funding from the term after their third birthday, so usually children start in the term after they turn three years old, providing places are available. Free entitlement funding (for age 3 and 4 children) becomes available as follows:

Your child's date of birth	Availability of Free Entitlement funding from the Government
Children born between Sept 1st - Dec 31st	Funding starts the following January
Children born between Jan 1st - March 31st	Funding starts the following April
Children born between April 1st - Aug 31st	Funding starts the following September

Does The Brook Nursery offer 30 hours Free entitlement funding for working parents?

Yes. All parents are entitled to the basic 15 hours of free nursery funding and some working parents are entitled to an additional 15 hours (30 in total) per week. This new government scheme was introduced in September 2017 and is seen as a credit for working parents. The criteria for the additional 15 hours is as follows:

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- Both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family) AND;
- Each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage (NMW) or national living wage (NLW) - basically this means you need to earn a minimum of £125 per week - and earn less than £100,000 per year.

Please note this includes employed and self employed parents as well as parents on zero hour contracts who meet the criteria. Parents who are on maternity, paternity or adoption leave or those who can't work because they are disabled or have caring responsibilities, could also be eligible.

To find out if you are entitled to claim the additional 15 hours, please visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk. Once you have been granted the additional 15 hours, you will be given a code which you must write onto your Free Entitlement Declaration form - we use this code to request your funding.

Can my child start when they are 3 years old and before their free government funding is available?

Yes. Children may start privately from the day of their third birthday but as no government funding is available until the term after their third birthday, all sessions are chargeable for that term. **Private places will only be allocated up to one month before your child's birthday**, for example for a birthday on 1st November, private places can only be allocated from 1st October. In some cases some children may be entitled to Free Entitlement funding for children aged 2 years old and this could be claimed from the time your child is three until the end of that term. Which sessions are available?

The Nursery is open term-time, 38 weeks of the year. We are closed during school holidays. We open in term time at 8.30am and our day ends at 3pm. Currently, there are four daily session options available:

Options:	Session times:
Option 1:	8.30am to 11.30am (3 hours)
Option 2:	12.00 - 3.00 (3 hours)
Option 3:	9.00 - 3.00 (6 hours)
Option 4:	8.30am to 3.00pm (6 ½ hours)

We ask that all children are collected on time from The Brook Nursery. Unfortunately, if there is persistent and regular lateness in the collection of children, there will be a late penalty charge of £5 per day.

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How many sessions should my child attend each week?

We ask that children attend for a minimum of two sessions per week as this helps them to settle in and feel part of nursery life. However, children can attend for as many sessions as required, providing they are available. We will try to give you the sessions that you request, but unfortunately this is not always available, in which case we will try to offer you the next best available option.

Can I choose different options on different days?

Yes. You can select a variety of session options within a week to suit your family life (please note sessions have to be the same each week). However, once agreed, these arrangements can only be changed on a termly basis. We ask, that 4 week's notice is given of any change you wish to make for the next term. These changes will be conditional upon the availability of places. Please note there is a £20 charge for changes to sessions made mid-term without the 4 week's notice.

Do I have to pay for the Nursery?

All children are entitled to a Free Entitlement government grant from the term after they become 3 years old. This funds each child for 15 hours of pre-school education and care for 38 weeks a year (for eligible working parents they can claim an additional 15 hours - 30 in total). As our Nursery offers sessions in excess of 3 hours, these are charged at £6 per hour.

How will decisions about the allocation of places be made?

Our guiding principle is to offer the highest quality education and care to as many local pre-school children as possible. Allocation of places will be based strictly on the criteria in our Admissions policy. Please refer to our 'Admissions policy' for more information.

When will I hear if my child has been offered a place?

You will receive a letter at the beginning of the term before they are due to start informing you whether your child has been offered a place. The letter will indicate what sessions your child has been offered. You must inform nursery as soon as possible if the sessions are not suitable.

What happens if my child is not offered a place or the particular sessions I have requested?

We will contact you in writing to let you know if no spaces or different spaces to those requested are available. We do operate a waiting list and so if sessions become available we will contact you. We do however, request that you notify us as soon as possible if you no longer require sessions for your child.

Is there an induction process for my child?

Yes. Once a place has been offered parents will receive a letter inviting them to a meeting. At the meeting an induction pack is handed out with details of the induction process and forms to be completed. If you are unable to attend the meeting and do not collect your child's pack within 2 weeks your place may be reallocated. This meeting will be followed up with a home visit by the nursery team and a stay and play session for your child.

Once my child starts, how do I communicate with nursery?

Working in partnership with parents is essential to your child's continued development and learning. Please refer to our 'Working in Partnership with Parents and Carers' for more information.

If my child gets a place in the Nursery, will they automatically get a place in one of the school's reception classes?

No. The local education authority manages admissions into school. You will receive information about school admissions in the autumn term before your child is due to start school. For schools admissions, parents should contact the West Sussex County Council Pupil Admissions Office on 033301 42903.
